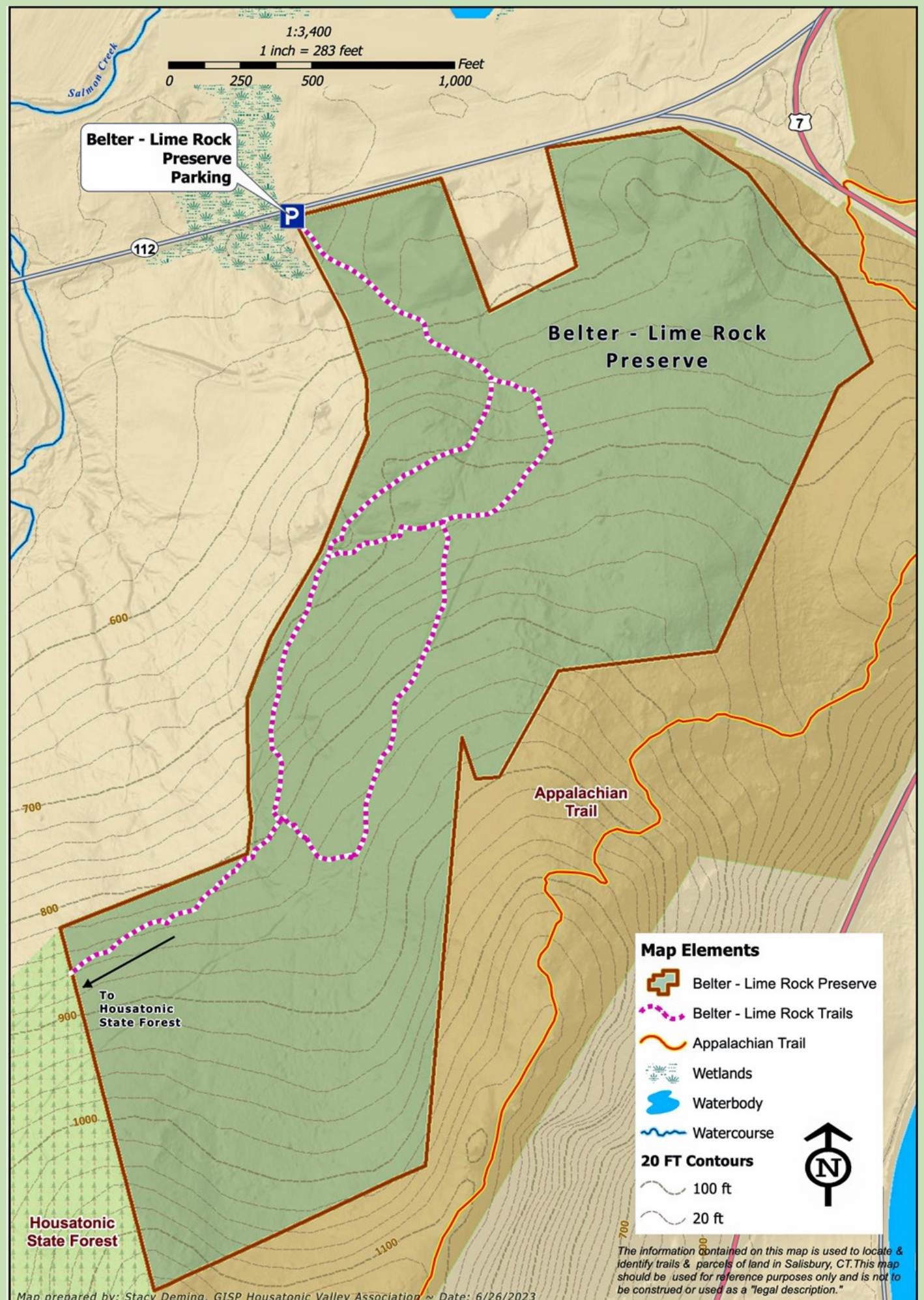

This 114 acre preserve was purchased by the Land Trust from the Belter family in 2022. The preserve was originally part of the 275 acre Rockydell farm owned by the Lorch family before being purchased by Garwood Belter in 1950. The property borders other protected land; the National Park Service Appalachian Trail corridor to the east and south and the Housatonic State Forest to the west.

The purchase was financed through grants from the State of Connecticut Open space and Watershed Land Acquisition Program, the Anne and Rollin Bates Foundation, the John T. and Jane A. Wiederhold Foundation, and the Wild East Program of the Appalachian Trail Conservancy.

Parking for several cars is off Rt 112, ¼ mile west of the Rt. 7 intersection.
